Project Description: The communities of Coffman Cove and Naukati pay an electric rate of 50 cents per kilowatt hour. Residents on the southern end of Prince of Wales are connected by Alaska Power and Telephone to the Black Bear Hydro Project. They pay 17 cents per kilowatt hour. Coffman Cove and Naukati cannot attract any businesses or industry at the present rate of electricity. To operate a single cooler for soda pop or milk is over \$600 per month. This project would extend the power lines from the current hydro grid 40 miles to Coffman Cove and another 10 miles to Naukati.

Help on this project will be the most effective boost to fostering a year round economy in tis part of Prince of Wales Island

This project is a continuation of the ongoing Corps of Engineers dock project. The The Corps has developed a plan to expand the dock for health, safety, and to support increased demand for dock space by commercial vessels such as the lower 48 fishing fleet. Coffman Cove is partnering in a small fish processing facility and needs adequate mooring for these vessels. The COE states that to build this requires a "full federal funds" waiver. This project will permit and fund the construction of this vitally needed dock at Coffman Cove. The city is a major transportation point as the southern terminus of the north bound Interisland Ferry Authority route of the MV Stikine. However, the current dock facility is insufficient to provide the infrastructure support necessary for the traffic generated by the IFA.

A BILL

To provide for the conveyance of certain Forest Service land to the city of
Coffman Cove, Alaska.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the
United States of America in Congress assembled,*

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the 'Coffman Cove Administrative Site
Conveyance Act of 2007'.

SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.

In this Act:

(1) CITY- The term 'City' means the city of Coffman Cove,
Alaska.

(2) SECRETARY- The term 'Secretary' means the Secretary of Agriculture.

SEC. 3. CONVEYANCE.

(a) In General- Subject to valid existing rights, the Secretary shall convey to the City, without consideration and by quitclaim deed all right, title, and interest of the United States, except as provided in subsections (c) and (d), in and to the parcel of National Forest System land described in subsection (b).

(b) Description of Land-

(1) IN GENERAL- The parcel of National Forest System land referred to in subsection (a) is the approximately 12 acres of land identified in U.S. Survey 10099, as depicted on the plat entitled 'Subdivision of U.S. Survey No. 10099' and recorded as Plat 2003-1 on January 21, 2003, Petersburg Recording District, Alaska.

(2) EXCLUDED LAND- The parcel of National Forest System land conveyed under subsection (a) does not include the portion of U.S. Survey 10099 that is north of the right-of-way for Forest Development Road 3030-295 and southeast of Tract CC-8.

(c) Right-of-Way- The United States may reserve a right-of-way to provide access to the National Forest System land excluded from the conveyance to the City under subsection (b)(2).

(d) Reversion- If any portion of the land conveyed under subsection (a) (other than a portion of land sold under subsection (e)) ceases to be used for public purposes, the land shall, at the option of the Secretary, revert to the United States.

(e) Conditions on Subsequent Conveyances- If the City sells any portion of the land conveyed to the City under subsection (a)--

(1) the amount of consideration for the sale shall reflect fair market value, as determined by an appraisal; and

(2) the City shall pay to the Secretary an amount equal to the gross proceeds of the sale, which shall be available, without further appropriation, for the Tongass National Forest.
