## FISCAL YEAR 2009 PROJECT REQUEST FORM

Project Name: Galena City School District

Project Location: Galena, AK

Galena's boarding school operations provide a safe and educationally enriching environment for 120 students, many of whom are Native Alaskans from 52 outlying villages where, in some instances, they may be exposed to a physically and emotionally challenging village environment. The boarding school has grown from 70 students several years ago to 123 today. The demand for more student space continues. Galena anticipates that the boarding school may reach over 300 students within the next four years. Due to a 2001 Department of Education formula change, Galena has lost \$1 million annually in Federal Impact Aid Funding (see detailed explanation attached). Galena requests funds to support residential hall services with student "assets development" sponsored in conjunction with the Alaska School Boards Association. Eighteen trained residential hall staff guide the 132 students through on going appraisals of the forty developmental assets each possess. Research supports greater success proportionally for students nurturing a greater number of assets. Funds will support staffing, training, food services, and transportation costs.

The asset development program is centered around concrete, common sense, positive experience and qualities essential to healthy life styles for young people. Currently the Alaska State Legislature funds the Galena Interior Learning Academy Residential Program at about one-third the dollar level provided to its state school Mt. Edgecombe. The school district continues to promote the service and value toward full funding.

The national significance of the Galena boarding school is that it provides a safe and educationally enriching environment for Native Alaskan children. The dropout rate for Native students is an alarming 40%, according to the US Department of Education.

The Galena School District (GSD), by virtue of a 2001 Department of Education formula change, has lost approximately \$1 million annually in Federal Impact Aid funding (Section 8003(b)(3)(B) of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 [20 U.S.C. 7703(b)(3)(B)]). This Federal Impact Aid is used to fund the Galena School District's boarding school costs for approximately 120 Alaska Native children. To date efforts to correct this DOE formula change through federal legislation have failed. The Federal Impact Aid program is, among other things, intended to provide federal funding to local districts for students who live on Indian land and federal lands. Generally, because such land is not subject to local property taxation, the Impact Aid program makes up for the loss of tax revenue which the local district might otherwise collect. 'Interior Distance Education of Alaska' (IDEA) is Galena's state-wide home schooling program. Because IDEA home school students do not attend school in Galena and live elsewhere in Alaska, Galena lacks the legal authority to tax property which is located elsewhere in the state. As a result of its 2001 decision, DOE now requires that the 3,600 IDEA home school students must be calculated in the formula for the purpose of determining the Impact Aid payments. Inclusion of these 3,600 students results in GSD eligible student count being reduced from 80 percent to 10 percent, resulting in a \$1 million annual Federal Impact Aid loss to Galena.

Galena received \$721,128 from the State of Alaska (FY08). While the FY09 State budget is not finalized, Galena expects to receive \$901,410 based upon the state law regarding formula funding.
