Project Description:

Transfer of ownership and operation of the Pelican Utility District, Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity #24, Pelican Fuel Dock Infrastructure and real property, "As Is, Where Is," operated by Pelican Seafoods, a division of Kake Tribal Corporation.

Project Justification:

1) Resolution 2004-9, approved the proposed development of a bulk fuel conceptual design report and requested that this report also assess the power generation needs of Pelican. The City of Pelican, as a qualified government entity, has access to Denali Commission funds for upgrades.

2) Resolution 2004-19, agreement in concept, under certain conditions, and contingent on a Congressional appropriation, the transfer of ownership of the Pelican Utility District, certificate of convenience #24, Pelican Fuel Dock and bulk fuel farm to the City of Pelican.

In September 2005, Alaska Energy Authority completed a Concept Design Report and Construction Estimate for Energy Infrastructure Projects in the Community of: Pelican.

3) Resolution 2006-4 identifies the infrastructure and real property for transfer.

4) Kake Tribal Corporation Resolution 2006-2 accepts and authorizes lease arrangements outlined in the City of Pelican's Resolution 2006-4.

The Alaska Energy Authority and State of Alaska, Department of Law provides professional and technical assistance in negotiating interim lease agreements.

The transfer of ownership and operations will promote economic development in Pelican and at the Pelican Seafoods cold storage and fish processing facility. Offering reasonable electrical rates is an incentive to process fish here.

**Commercial fishing is important to Pelican's long-term sustainability.
A reliable fuel dispensing facility will continue to bring the fleet into our port.
A reliable hydro facility will keep utility costs down.**
